

The Sino-Danish Center (SDC) was established in 2010 as a partnership between all eight Danish universities, the Chinese Academy of Sciences (CAS), and the University of Chinese Academy of Sciences (UCAS). Acting as a dynamic platform for Danish and Chinese companies, DCBF supports knowledge exchange, networking, and collaboration across industries. By connecting members with valuable insights and opportunities, the forum strengthens bilateral ties and promotes sustainable growth, innovation, and cultural understanding between the two nations.
